

**Joint Drainage District No. 61, Clay, Dickinson and Emmet  
October 19, 1999**

Minutes of the meeting of the Joint Board of Supervisors of Clay, Dickinson, and Emmet counties, Iowa acting for and on behalf of Joint Drainage District #61 Clay, Dickinson and Emmet.

The Joint Board met at 2:00 P.M. on October 19, 1999, at the Terril Legion Building, Terril, Iowa. Present were: Emmet County—Supervisors Ron Smith, Roger Anderson, Donald Heerdt, Rollie Jasper, Wayne West, County Auditor Bev Juhl and Robert Prentice; Clay County—Supervisors Ken Chalstrom, Joel Sorenson, Del Brockshus, Sylvia Schoer, County Auditor Margie Linn, County Engineer R. K. Clark, Drainage Technician Frank Rouse; Dickinson County—Supervisors Wayne Northey, June Goldman and David Gottsche, County Auditor Nancy Reiman, County Engineer Daniel Eckert and interested landowners of the joint drainage district.

Moved by Supervisor Sorenson, seconded by Supervisor West to appoint Supervisor David Gottsche as Chairperson of the Joint Drainage District and County Auditor Nancy Reiman as Secretary. All voted aye.

Richard Hoper, Jacobson/Westergard & Associates, Inc., present with some history of the joint drainage district work for the past few years and a cost estimate to reclassify the district of 25,324 acres to be \$1.50 to \$2.00 per acre. A current request for repairs to the district is estimated to be \$15,000. There is \$19,400 outstanding stamped warrants and \$6760 interest due on said warrants. There was discussion on the need to relevy for the district as well as reclassification.

Moved by Supervisor Northey, to relevy as assessment of 26% against all lands in Drainage District No. 61 CDE according to the current classification. Seconded by Supervisor Heerdt. Ayes—Goldman, Gottsche, Northey, Sorenson, Chalstrom, Brockshus, Schoer, Anderson, Heerdt, Jasper. Nays—West and Smith.

Moved by Supervisor Anderson, seconded by Supervisor Smith to have a hearing to consider reclassification for Drainage District Joint 61 CDE to be set for January, 2000. All voted aye.

Moved by Supervisor Goldman, seconded by Supervisor West to set the interest rate for the relevy and future stamped warrants at 7%. All voted aye.

Moved by Supervisor Smith, seconded by Supervisor Schoer to set November 15, 1999 as the date of relevy. All voted aye.

The Dickinson County Secondary Road Department will continue to research and explore the repair request of Mr. McGuire and will report to the full board at the next meeting.

Meeting adjourned to the call of the Chairperson.
